Introduction

Covid-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus.

This risk assessment has been developed to outline the measures required to minimise the COVID-19 infection risks associated with reopening our entertainment venues to both our staff and customers. This assessment covers the risks associated with a number of different broad functions including event & productions teams, food and beverage teams, front of house teams include hosts, stewards and security staff, office staff, facility management teams including cleaners and technicians. The assessment includes the risks to those that visit our premises including customers, contractors and artists.

Background

In response to the most recent Government Announcement that England will move to revoke all Covid legislation with effect from April 2022 in response to the declining Covid infection rates. The risk assessment has been reviewed and amended in light of the new Government guidance.

ASM Global has developed a program entitled *Venue Shield* which outlines good practice methods to reduce the potential spread of the virus. These methods include cleaning and sanitisation, customer journey, employee guidance, the serving of food and beverage, what technology and products can be used and how we communicate any new procedures to employees, customers and contractors. Much of guidance within VenueShield still remains relevant as infection rates are increasing as we move out of Lockdown.

						Staff are encouraged to wash their hands for 20 seconds on a regular basis however disinfection wipes and hand sanitiser will be readily available throughout the premises. PPE and Face Masks				
						Employees who already use PPE for their work activity to protect against non-COVID-19 risks, should continue to do so. The wearing of face coverings or masks is now personal choice of the individual.
